Answer these True/False questions about plunder and the perversion of the law:

1. “A law that bans theft is the same kind of law as one that redistributes wealth.”
2. “Taking money from citizens to give to a favored company is plunder.”
3. “If a majority votes for it, it becomes morally right.”
4. “A law is just when it treats theft as theft, no matter who does it.”
5. “Using the law to protect your property is plunder.”
6. “People will fight harder over politics when the law becomes a tool for getting benefits.”
7. “Plunder can be done peacefully through legislation.”
8. “A person can oppose theft, but support it when it’s called a *program*.”
9. “When the law does what individuals may not do (steal), it becomes corrupted.”
10. “If something helps the poor, it cannot be unjust.”
