Answer these True/False questions that review Civics concepts:

1. “According to Romans 13:3, rulers are meant to be a terror to good works rather than to evil.”
2. “The Greek word *phobos* in Romans 13:3 is the root of the English word *phobia*.”
3. “*Evil* that rulers should punish is defined in the Bible as any behavior that is sinful or immoral.”
4. “Acts 16:28 and Acts 28:5 use the same Greek word translated as *evil* to refer to a prison guard’s harming himself and a venomous snake that doesn’t harm Paul when it bites him.”
5. “Government’s proper purpose is to punish actions that harm the person, liberty, or property of others.”
6. “Jealousy and hatred are examples of evil that government should punish with force.”
7. “Romans 13:4 describes rulers as ‘ministers of God.’”
8. “The ‘sword’ in Romans 13:4 refers to capital punishment.”
9. “Government ‘solutions’ often create new problems that lead to more government intervention.”
10. “A Christian government is the best way to stamp out immorality in society.”
11. “Jesus instructed His followers to use government power to resist evil.”
12. “1 Corinthians 5 instructs Christians to judge immoral behavior within the church, not outside it.”
