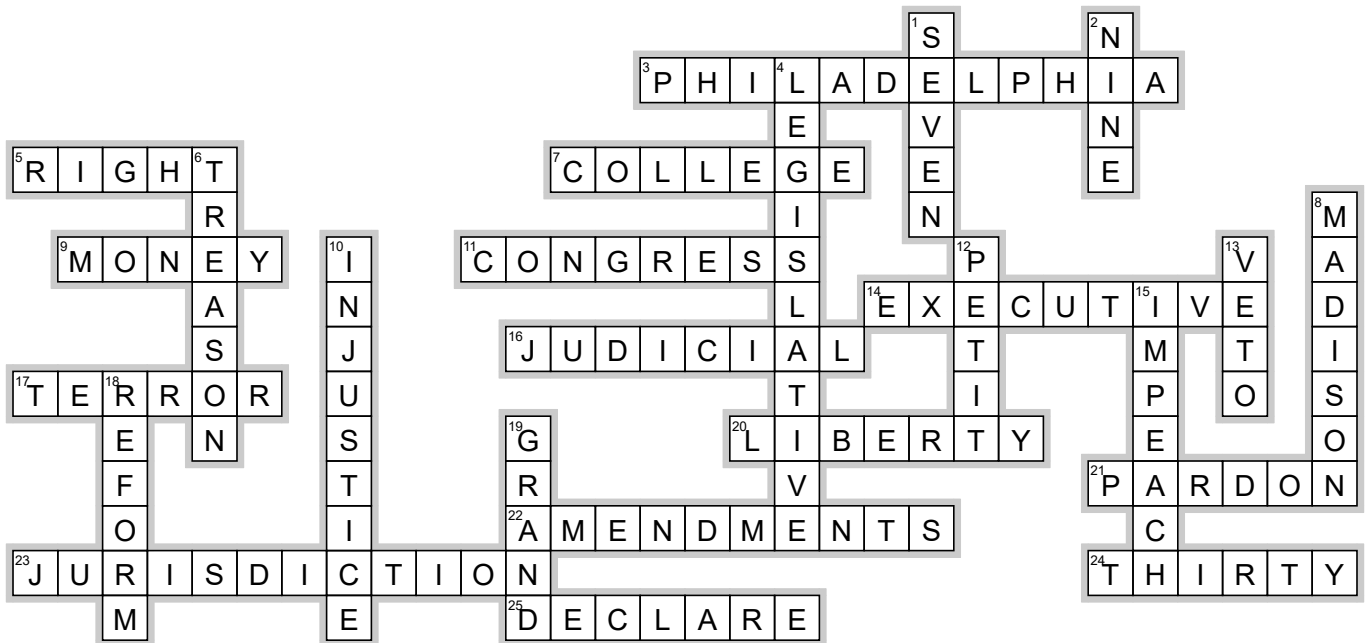


## ***Civics: A Christian Worldview. Crossword Puzzle 7 (20-25 minutes)***

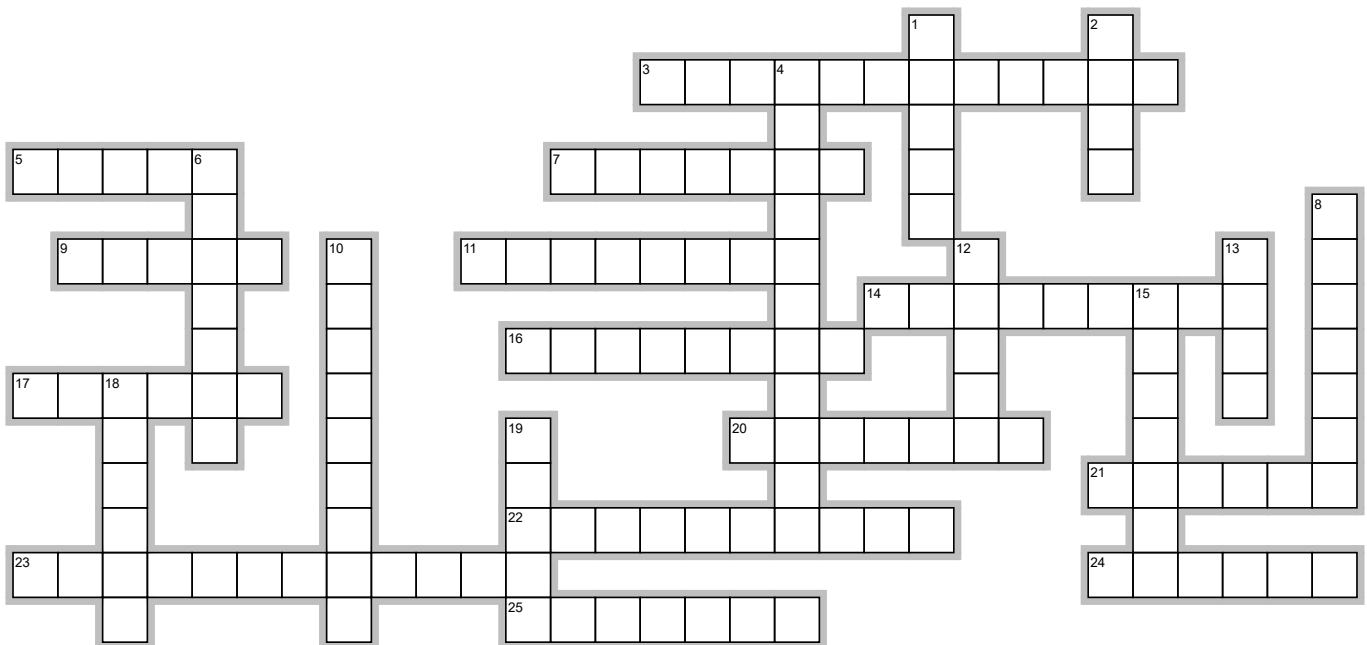
### **Teacher Instructions**
