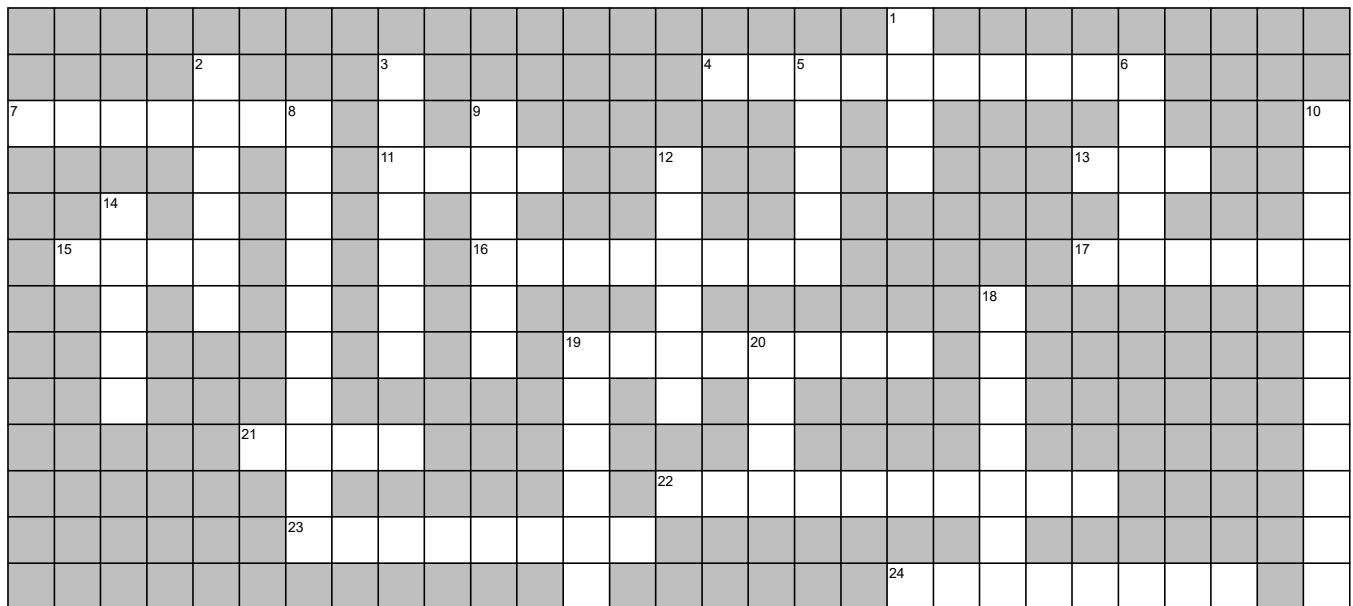


Economics: A Christian Worldview. Crossword Puzzle 5 (20 minutes)
