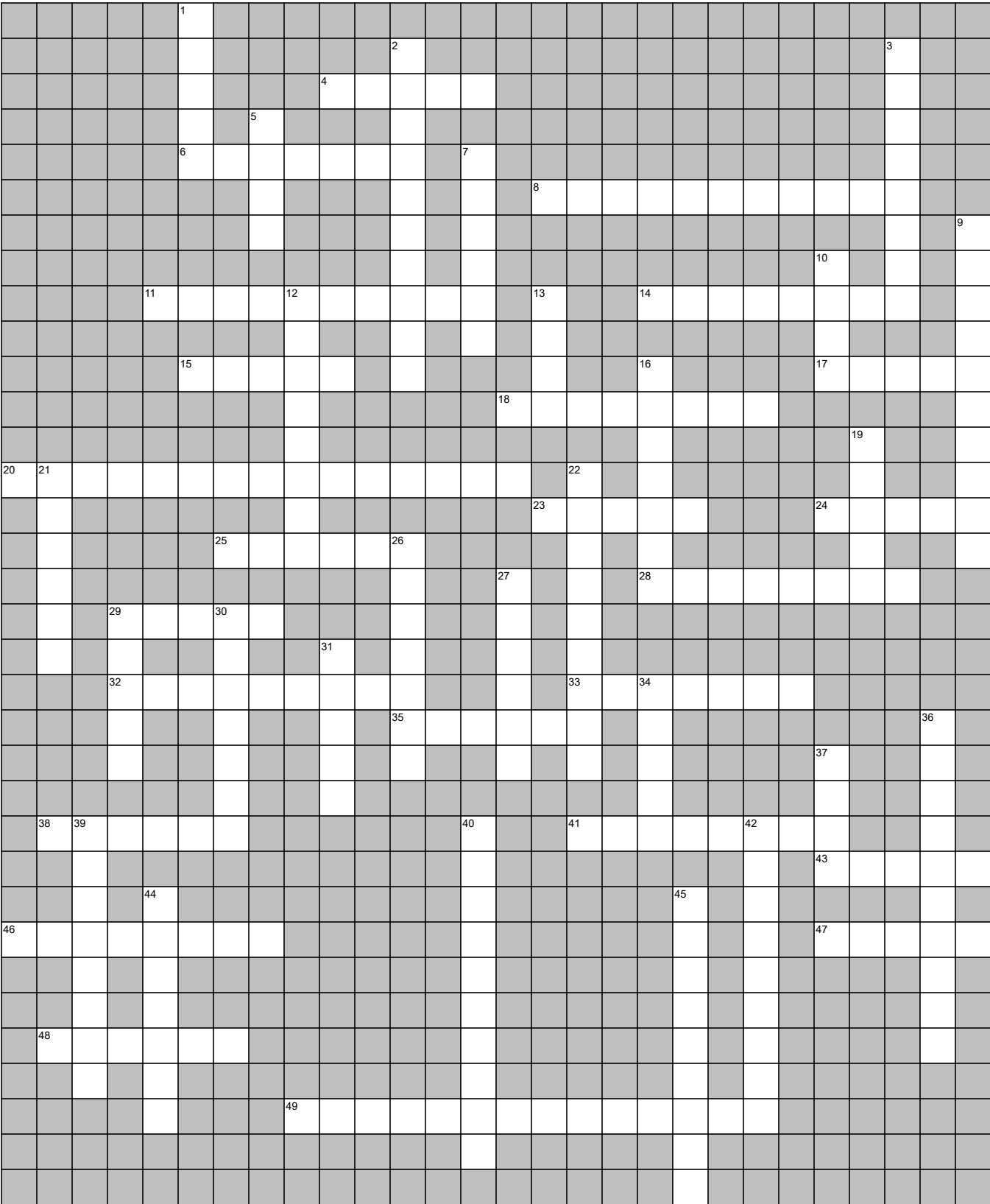


Economics: A Christian Worldview. Crossword Puzzle 7 (30-35 minutes)
